1. Welcome, introductions and apologies

4. Devolution update – Will Morlidge, D2N2 LEP

- link to East Midlands Devolution website
- Joe Battye, Chair of the CCA Skills and Education Board, reports that the group are looking at recommendations for the new mayor and are having preliminary discussions with DfE on how devolved funding will work in practice
- DfE implementation funding is being applied for to help prepare for delivering AEB, which will be devolved from August 2025
- Will and Edward are working with Joe to identify the role of the current D2N2 People & Skills Advisory Board in the new governance structure
- D2N2 and local authority colleagues have a skills planning day scheduled for 28/4/23
- 5. D2N2 Local Skills Improvement Plan update Natalie Gasson-McKinley, Federation of Small Business

See Natalie's presentation and interim emerging priorities report

- the final report is due to be published at the end of May but colleges have received an interim report to enable them to respond to it as part of their DfE accountability agreement requirements
- 5 key emerging themes have been identified from consultations Work readiness and soft skills; Digitalisation; Net Zero; Local socio-economic conditions; Approach to training
- further event taking place 19/4/23 to develop actionable priorities, then the report will be shared with wider stakeholders for final comment; the report should look at immediate, medium and long term priorities
- the LSIP can be amended post-May if additional content is made available, for example data expected from the Employer Skills Survey
- it was suggested that although the LSIP is focusing on L3 qualifications, it should keep in mind higher levels to raise aspirations and link with the new Institute of Technology
- the consultation highlighted that employers either didn't know about the local skills system or found it difficult to navigate; more work is needed to promote and make the system simple to understand

- issue of funding from different government departments will be resolved when channelled through the CCA
- 6. Apprenticeship Review revised draft Fiona Baker, D2N2 LEP See Fiona's presentation
 - following the January PSAB meeting, Fiona has updated the Apprenticeship Review to include an analysis of low achievement
 - factors involved in low achievement rates are complex and measurement is not always straightforward
 - D2N2 to develop a Skills and Education Landscape campaign targeting SMEs (see next agenda item)
 - D2N2 to set up Task & Finish group to develop an Apprenticeship and Technical Education Transitions Framework
 - PSAB members accepted the revised Apprenticeship Review and action plan
